

Watchmen even Casco record at 2-2

The C.S. Lewis boys basketball team picks up a victory Tuesday at Falls City

FALLS CITY - The C.S. Lewis Academy boys basketball team outscored Falls City 12-2 in the final 2:30 Tuesday to capture a 58-52 win against the Mountaineers.

Down 50-46, C.S. Lewis Academy senior Vas Walker hit a shot to pull the Watchmen to 50-48. After a Falls City turnover, Blake Boddington scored on a drive to tie the game. After Falls City failed to convert on its following possession, Walker hit an 18-footer to give the Watchmen a lead they would never relinquish.

Walker added one more score before Boddington sealed the victory with a pair of free throws in the closing moments.

Walker scored 14 of his game-high 21 points in the fourth quarter. Walker shot 8 of 12 from the field, was 1 of 2 on three-pointers and made both free throw attempts. He also added six rebounds, two assists and five blocked shots.

"It was the best game of the season for him," C.S. Lewis coach Dave Brown said. "He played really well. He was all over the place and in the second half, he really played big."

The Watchmen got off to a good start in the game by seizing an early 7-2 lead. However, Walker, along with senior guard Tim Fodge, quickly got in foul trouble and the Mountaineers took advantage to earn a 32-21 halftime lead. C.S. Lewis outscored Falls City 37-20 in the second half.

"It was a fun game," Brown said. "It was good. They were a little better than I thought they would be. Each team was evenly matched, too. They had a little size on us, but I think our guards were a little better than them."

Along with Walker's 21 points, Boddington added 14 points by going 3 of 4 from the field and 2 of 6 on three-pointers. He also added five rebounds and four steals.

Guard Gabe Leatherman added nine points and guard Ryan Haffner had seven. Post Cody Milton had two points and 10 rebounds.

The victory improved the Watchmen to 2-2 in the Casco League and 6-5 overall.

The Watchmen return to action today (Saturday) with a 8:30 p.m. game at Columbia Adventist. The road game concludes a brutal stretch for the Watchmen, who played 10 of their first 12 games on the road. Starting Tuesday with a home game against Perrydale, the Watchmen play six of their next eight games at home.
